The technician will also do a visual inspection while pumping. They look for cracks, leaks, or other signs of damage inside the tank. They might also check the filter and baffles to make sure the system is working right.

The technician will rinse the tank and lines after pumping if needed. This will help get rid of stubborn sludge. They'll also tell you what caused the emergency, like too much water use, overdue pumping, or something else.

Lastly, you'll get suggestions for how to keep things in good shape. This could mean setting up regular pumping every three to five years, saving water, or not flushing things that won't break down.
